VI. Healthy Families Update	Susan LeBlanc provided an update on Healthy Families activities. Ms. LeBlanc said the Healthy Families team is doing an outstanding job and exceeded all 14 of the quarterly outcomes. The retention rate is at 50% and up 7% from last year. 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Challenges	<p>are at 92.24% and infant rate at 80.96%. Ms. Philio said next Newsletter will be out at the end of March. Healthy Start is on Face Book and is updated weekly. Ms. Philio said the Motherhood Matters brochure and the grief toolkit will be available on the Healthy Start website soon.</p> <p>SMA Behavioral Services – Judy Seltz said ninety-five percent of participants who had an initial contact will go on to further assessments. Our outcome measure is at 93%. Ms. Seltz said of those 56% declined services, 24% were too busy, 43% live in SE Volusia mainly Deland and 16% in East Volusia. Gladys Roman and Judy will be performing an analysis on the declines. Judy Ryan said a couple partners you may want to meet at are the Good Samaritan Clinic in Deland or the Federally Qualified Health Center in Deland and Pierson. Ms. Seltz said those that go on to further assessment are at 79%. Ms. Seltz said they transitioned in a new Healthy Start team from the Children’s Advocacy Center. Ms. Seltz said during the second quarter 155 participants provided Child Birth Education, 127 Breastfeeding and 52 Smoking Cessation training.</p> <p>Children’s Advocacy Center – Karen Horzepa said the Early Steps program served over 500 children. Ms. Horzepa said they work with 25 service providers.</p> <p>Outreach Community Care Network – Barbara Preston said they continue to meet their outcomes. Ms. Preston said staff also received training on Child Birth Education, Breastfeeding and Smoking Cessation. Ms. Preston said they fell short on ages and stages and updating the family safety plan. Ms. Morgese said OCCN will be opening a new clinic and will be transitioning the Healthy Start team on March 31st to the Volusia County Health Department.</p> <p>Children’s Medical Services – Judy Ryan said they are waiting to hear the outcome from the state level and see what changes will occur. Ms. Morgese thanked Judy for her help with a few children at The Chiles Academy.</p>		Submit articles to Cher.	

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	<p>Volusia County Health Department – Livia Horne said they are also waiting for the outcome from the state and what cuts may occur. Livia said Dr Rawji will be coming to their clinic a couple days a week to see patients. Ms. Horne said they are seeing an increase in late entry into prenatal care (37-38 weeks). Ms. Horne said she met with the Pregnancy Crisis Center in Deltona.</p> <p>Dr. Margaret Crossman works with the local Pregnancy Crisis Center and provided a Marketing flyer.</p> <p>Volusia County Health Department WIC – Lisa Funchess said they are tracking early prenatal entry into WIC monthly.</p> <p>January - 199 prenatal enrolled in the program 125 early entry within first 13 weeks 62.81%</p> <p>December – 242 prenatal enrolled in the program 140 early entry within first 13 weeks 57.85%</p> <p>Ms. Funchess said they are above the state outcomes and at 52.50%. They are expanding the WIC program in the NW corner and the 32114 zip code. Ms. Ryan said they are welcome to come back to Keech Street.</p> <p>Flagler County Health Dept - Bonnie Welter said they are making changes to their scheduling system. They are seeing more walk-ins and making appointments later in the day. Ms. Welter said they saw 276 patients last year. Ms. Welter said they have a new WIC Supervisor Michelle Morale at the FCHD.</p> <p>Halifax OB/GYN Associates – Pat Kruse said they are collaborating with Agape Midwifery. Ms. Kruse said HOGA continues to see patients at the FCHD and the clinic is full on Monday afternoon. Ms. Kruse said since attending the Health and Human Services Summit held in October they are performing drug screens as part of the initial OB visit. Ms Kruse said they will be providing services at the Department of Corrections.</p>			

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	<p>Agape Midwifery – Karen Kennedy-Tyus said they had 89 cases, 15 of which were new and they are down from last quarter. Karen said they are at The Chilies Academy on Mondays. Karen said (18) are on family planning and seeing (4) OBs. Karen said Child Birth Education is including during their 30 minute visit. Karen said classes will begin within the next month at their office and The Chiles Academy. Karen said Medicaid cut midwife deliveries by \$400.00. Karen thanked Claudette Jenkins for her help with one of their clients.</p> <p>Mental Health Association – Cheryl Capdevilla said they have a new counselor in the Flagler area. Ms. Capdevilla said they have 45 open cases open. Ms Capdevilla said their Annual Meeting is Friday, January 28, 2011 from 11 11:30am -1:00pm at the Daytona Kennel Club. Ms. Capdevilla said they have had challenges with recording.</p>
