LSF Funding

- Grant supports an intensive high risk team
- Funds available through 6/30/16
- Delays in contract completion
- Identifying client challenges
- Staffing process
- May bill for services for the adults and the infants and other children
- Must follow formulary for units



Components funded through LSF

- Intake/Assessment
- Care Coordination/Case Management
- Peer Recovery Specialist
- Infant Mental Health/Circle of Security
- Perinatal Mood Disorder/Post Partum Depression
- Medication Support
- Family Planning
- UF Mindfulness Training for Workforce
- Multidisciplinary Staffing – coordination with birth center environments
- Transition to/from residential treatment



Intersecting Services/Continuity

- Women's Intervention – East and West Side for pregnancy and neonates
- Opioid Management – providers who will support 2nd and 3rd trimester management
- In-Treatment Support – Circle of Security, PPD, Peer Recovery, Assessment/Care Coordination
- Outpatient options - Chrysalis
- Multi-disciplinary Staffing
- Family Planning



Figure 1: Process & Resources – Pregnancy Algorithm

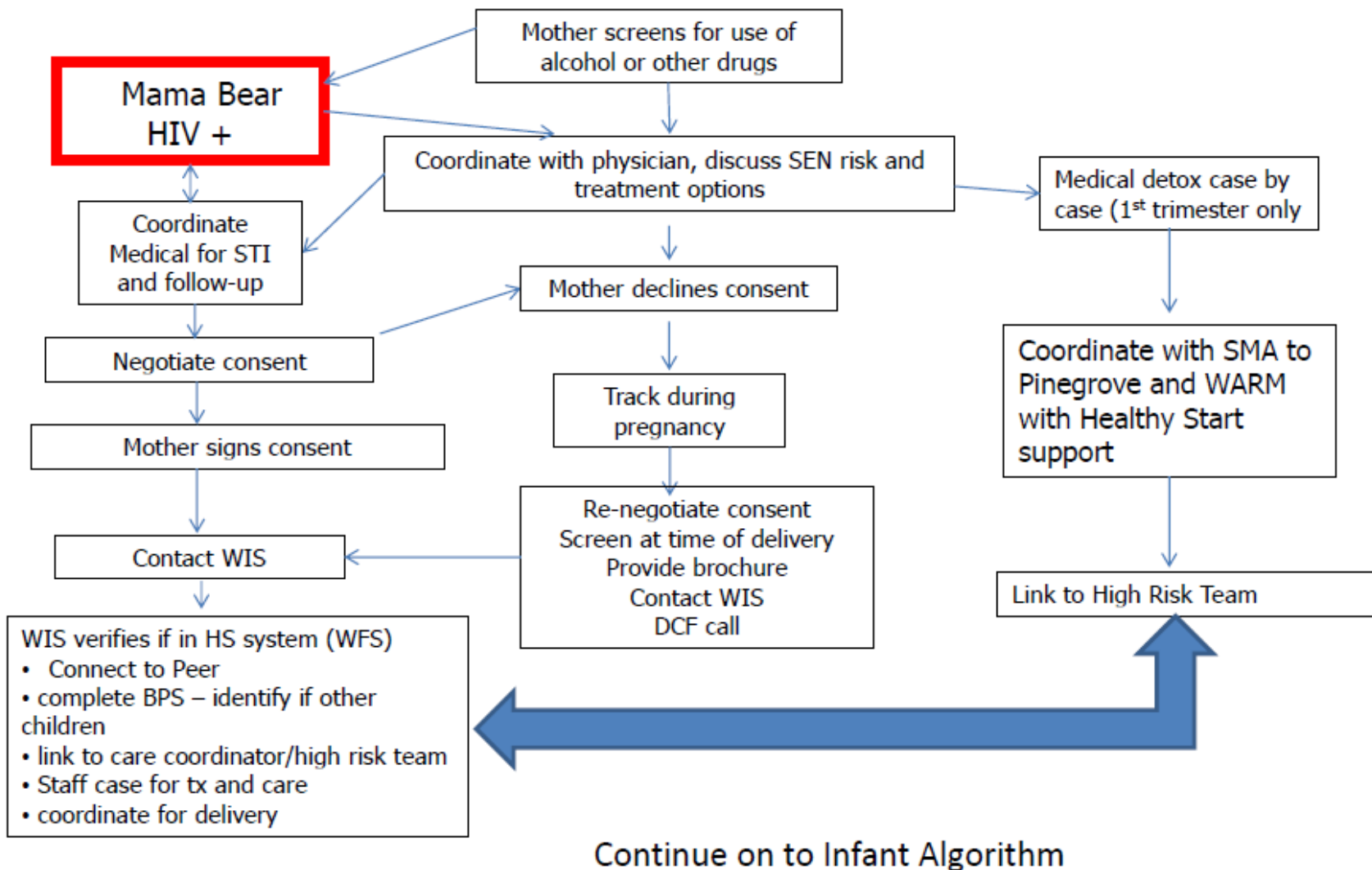
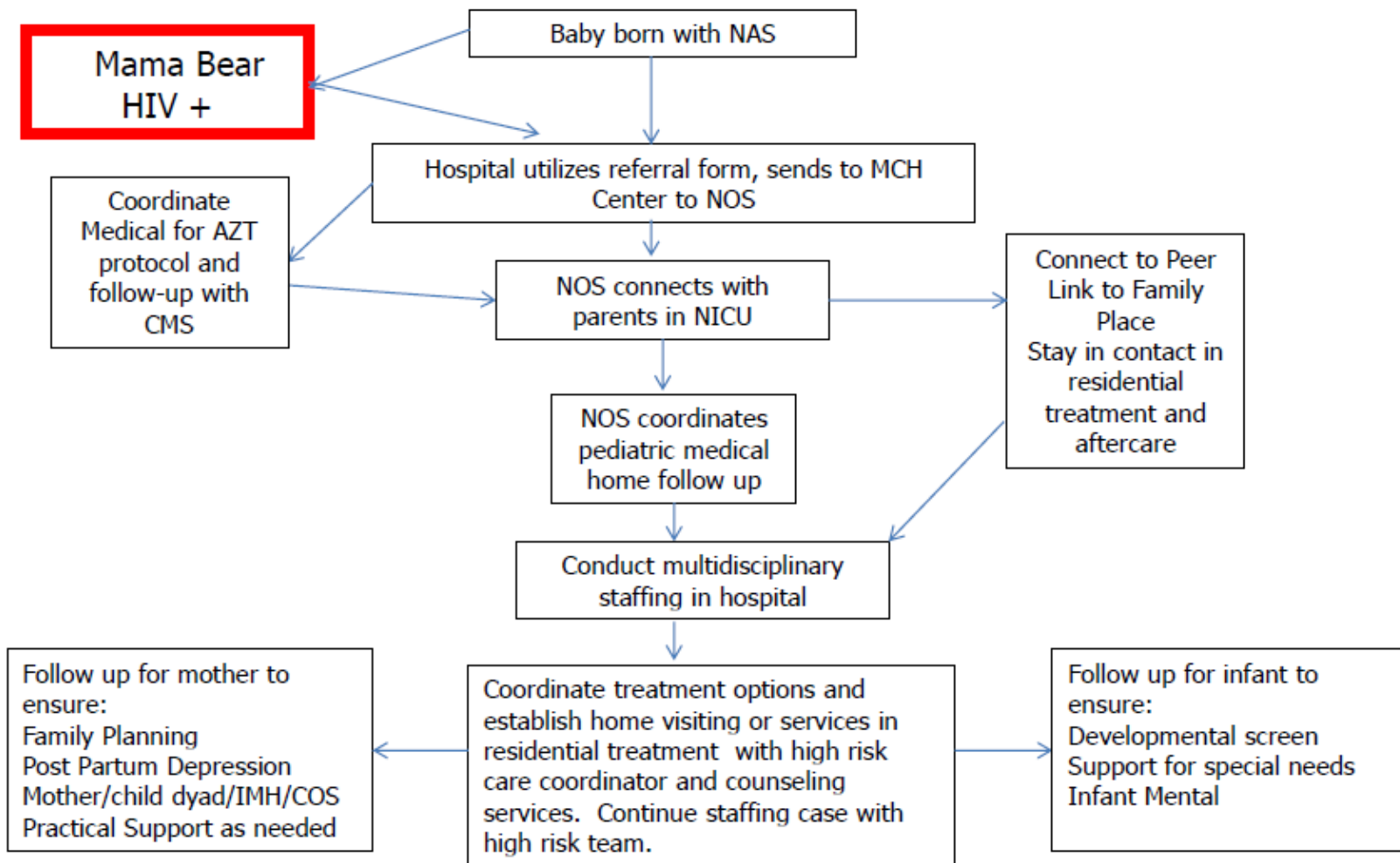


FIGURE 2: Process & Resources – Neonate NAS Algorithm



Opioid Management for Women Past First Trimester

- Limited OB/GYN physicians accepting opioid managed pregnant women.
- Contact Healthy Start Women's Intervention Specialist at SMA at 386-254-1226
- West Volusia Hospital Authority providing an additional WIS/NOS for Wrap around services with Family Health Source Wed. evenings and Saturdays.
- Other?



Volusia County Branch Jail

- Opioid Management beginning for pregnant women.
- DTC providing services
- Women can't pay for dosing when they get out
- OB/GYN's do not want to take into care when they are on management and can't maintain due to affordability



Continuing Gaps in Service

- Residential options for opioid managed women in Volusia/Flagler counties are not available.
- Residential options even if we can get women's dose down is limited for post partum women.
- Cases continue to be complex and care coordination is critical.
- Payment for opioid management during pregnancy will be available through LSF in our service area only for dosing down.
- Need management while waiting for a bed to become available.



Post Partum/Neonatal/Infant

- Neonatal Outreach Services – expanded to West Volusia if WVHA funding approved
- Multi-disciplinary Staffing in Hospital(s) – three times weekly – MOA with Healthy Start under review for Halifax and NEFHS
- DCF and CPC coordination – family engagement, safe baby court team, Infant Mental Health, other?
- Family Planning – coordinate with Health Department



WARM (Women Assisting Recovering Mothers) Update

- Capacity – pregnant women are prioritized.
- Creates challenges when dosing women down and case can be “bumped”.
- Women with case plans are delayed in reuniting with infant
- Dr. Boris tour of facility – Circle of Security
