The Child Abuse Neglect (CAN) outcome during participation is at 97% and 100% who have completed the program for no maltreatment findings. Ms. LeBlanc said the Junior League held their baby shower this month for 30 of the HF families. Baskets were also provided for our families who were not able to attend. A flyer was distributed with information on the dialogues. Tremendee Green, Family Services Coordinator, continues to link families to services at the Daytona Family Place. Since 2013, Community Partnership for Children and Healthy Start has merged a partnership. Mr. Best said the family engagement advisory board continues to meet. HS Update - Provider Service Delivery Accomplishments/ Challenges Update Women’s Intervention(WIS), Neonatal Outreach Specialist (NOS), HF Assessment	<p>The following providers gave a report on their accomplishments and challenges.</p> <p>SMA Behavioral Services – Nathaniel Loucks said their offices moved from Ridgewood out to Tiger Bay. Open house is planned for the future. Mr. Loucks said they are looking forward to an increase in funding. Shaniqua Bell is moving into another position and leaving Healthy Start program. Mr. Loucks said they are looking for a WIS/NOS for the west side and has posted the position. Susanna Simon and Karen Lawler will be retiring. Mr. Loucks said services continue and screening levels are trending a little lower. Mr. Loucks said they had 17 NOS referrals last month and there was 18 for this month. Mr. Loucks said everyone will complete Common Health Worker certification. Brandy Panariello was introduced as the new Assistant Director.</p> <p>Healthy Communities – Cher Philio said a car seat training was held in September for three days. They now have trained staff at both hospitals. Ms. Philio said there were 20 community development activities held, 49 Facebook post and 42 provider visits during the last quarter.
