Opioid Management for Women Past First Trimester

- Halifax is working to determine how to provide a continuum for women who present at the hospital for care prior to delivery.
- Lutheran Services is coordinating with Healthy Start to explore an integrated services approach with a medical component.
- West Volusia has prenatal clinical services through Family Health Source and Dr. Rawji is subutex certified.



Continuing Gaps in Service

- Residential options for opioid managed women in Volusia/Flagler counties are not available.
- Dr. Carbiener will continue to support as able but needs coordinated ancillary service support. (This includes transportation, housing, specialized medical services, coordination prior to the birth, support if the woman is determined to detox on her own)
- Cases continue to be complex and care coordination is critical.
- Payment for opioid management is not available through Medicaid.



WARM (Women Assisting Recovering Mothers) Update

- Capacity – moms & children – expanded capacity to respond to Windward

- ACES – baseline scores continue to be measured

Child Abuse Prevention Plan Update

- Submitted July 17th, 2015.
- Developed 3 priority areas
- Will convene meetings quarterly to update information
- Statewide Plan will now be developed



3 Priority Areas

Priority 1

Reduce preventable child injury and fatality.

Priority 2

Improved access to information and/or services for all parents and caregivers of children under age 18.

Priority 3

Increase trauma-informed awareness, education and response using the protective factors framework.

Strategy Discussion

- **Priority 1:** Safe Sleep, Proper use of car seats, drowning prevention, overheating in cars as well as coordinated review of death cases through the child death review and the Fetal Infant Mortality Review (for children under 1 year of age)
- **Priority 2:** Marketing and enhancement of 2-1-1 system and other available information and referral systems, Help Me Grow initiative, Coordinating circuit-wide.
- **Priority 3:** Setting achievable objectives related to staff development of employees within systems with high risk families and means of more effective screening and response circuit-wide.

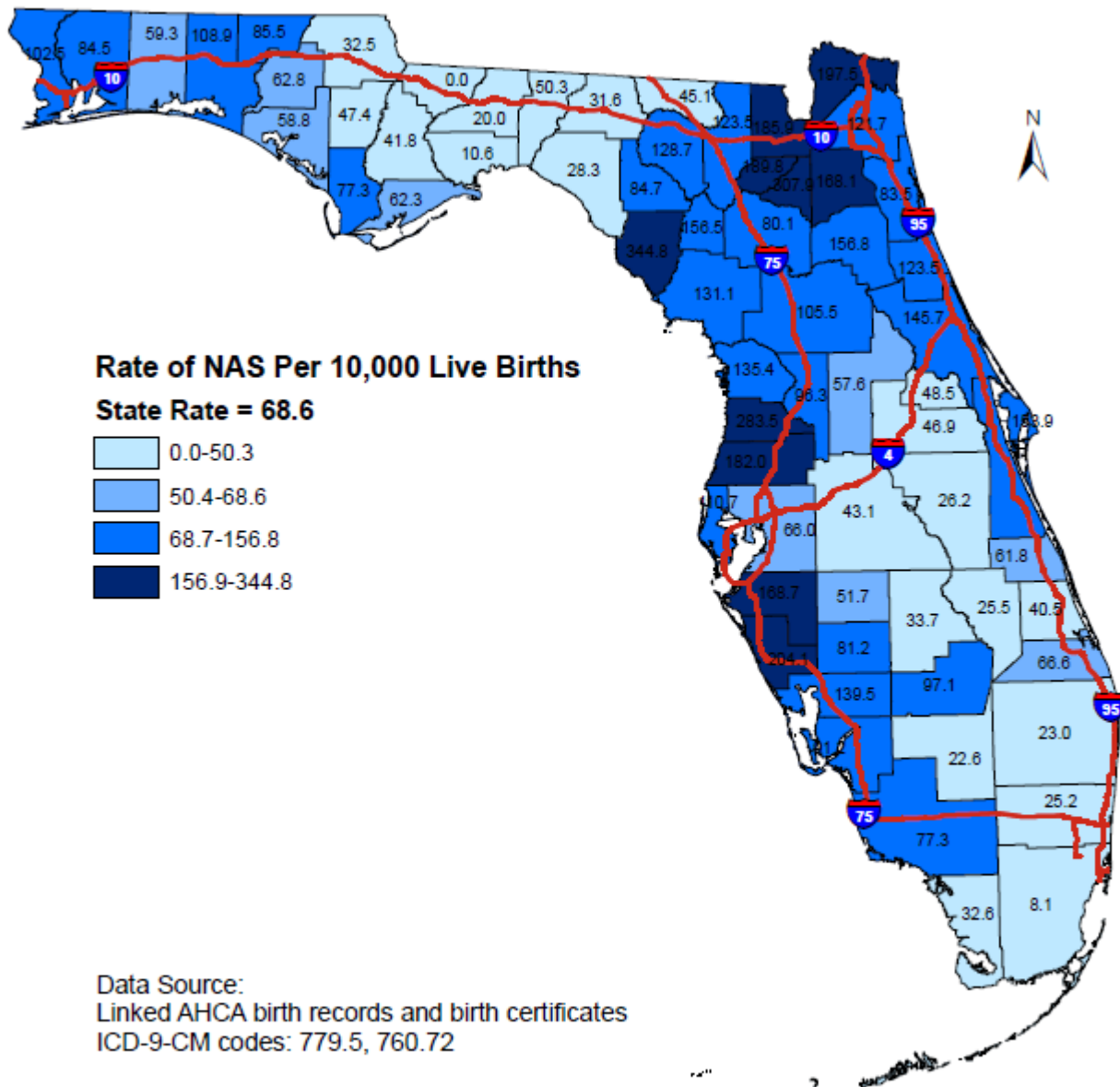


Figure 1. Prevalence Rates of Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome Per 10,000 Live Births, 2008- 2013

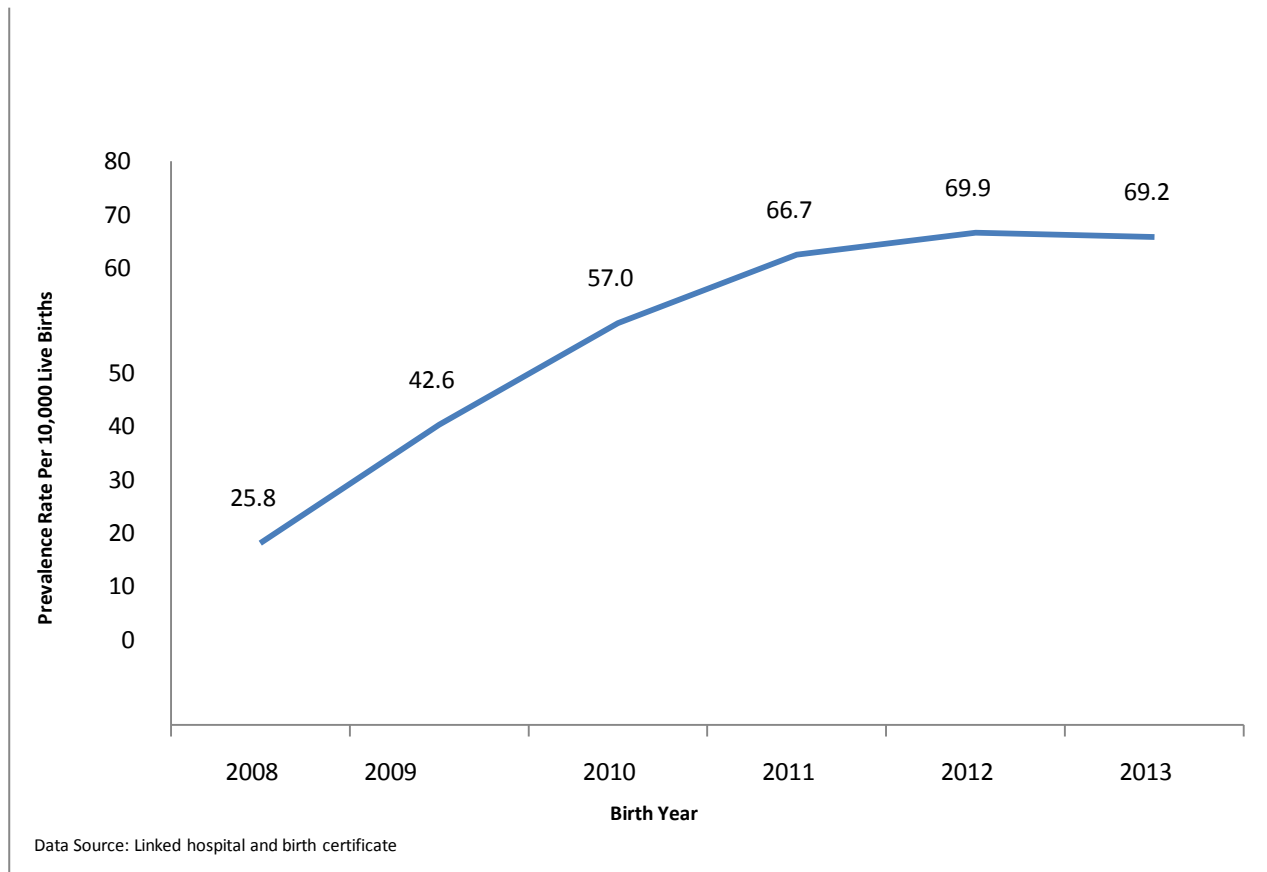
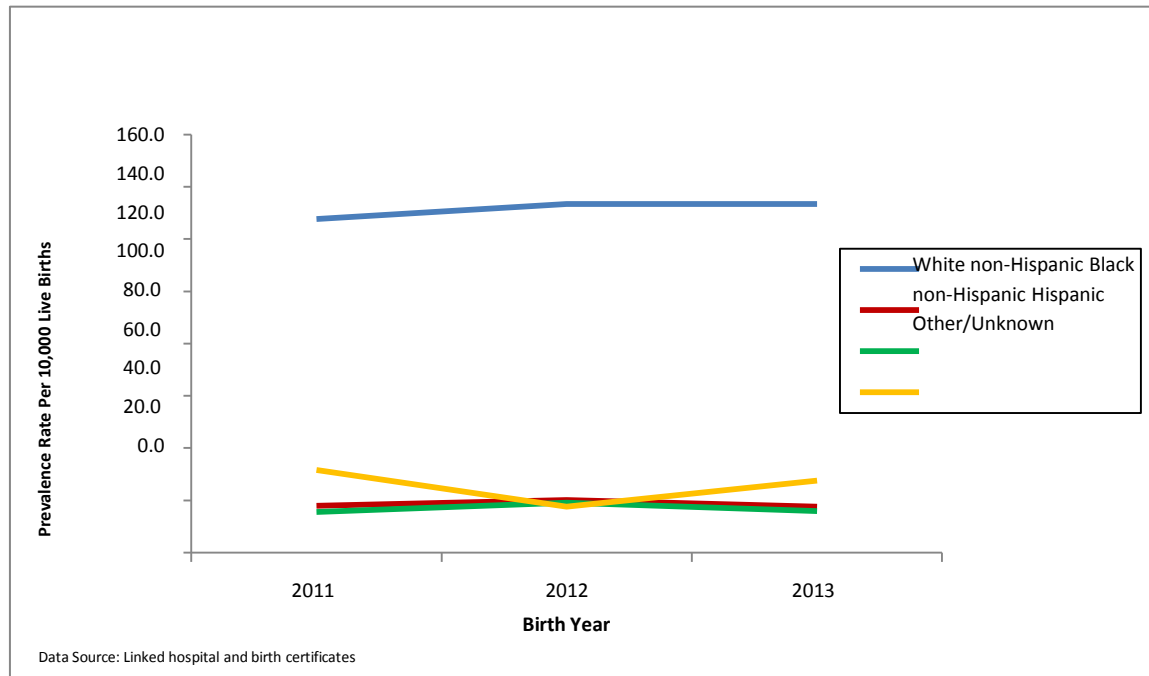


Figure 2. Prevalence Rates of Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome Per 10,000 Live Births by Maternal Race and Ethnicity, 2011-2013

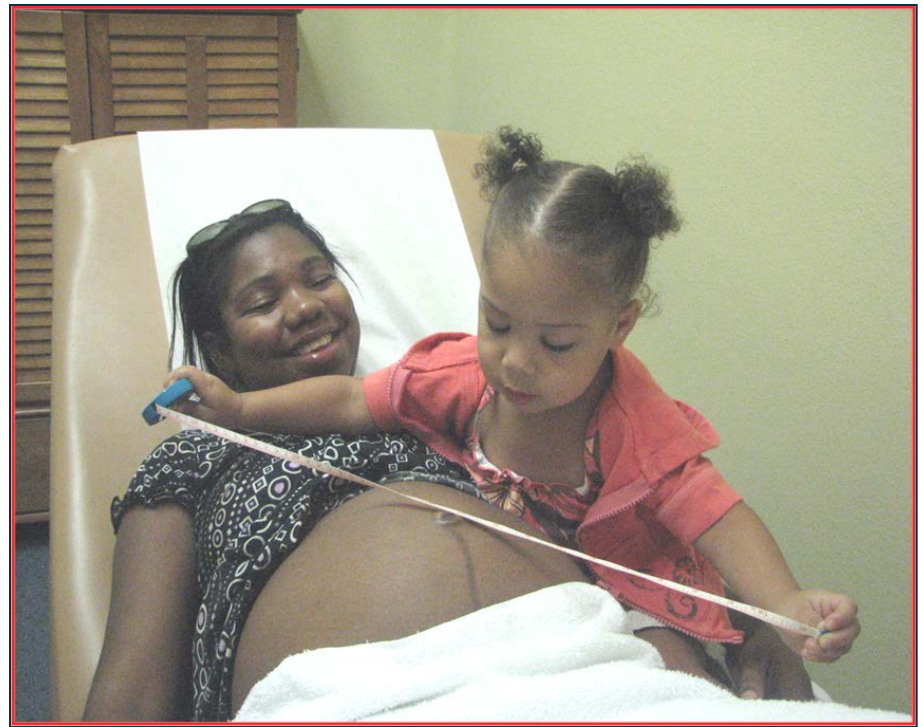
